We ensure that our schemes of work fully consider all mandated elements of the curriculum, namely religion, values and ethics, relationship and sexuality education, Welsh and English.

As a cluster we recognise that the purpose of <u>assessment</u> is to support each individual learner to progress appropriately, ensuring that they are supported and challenged accordingly. All schools in the cluster will follow their assessment guidelines which have a focus on continuously supporting individual learners, monitoring and reflecting on learner progress over time together with understanding the progress of groups of learners which allows continuous evaluation to inform future provision.

We will constantly reflect and refine the curriculum with learner voice activities playing a strong role in the self-evaluation processes at department and whole school level. During the year we will offer a virtual evening for parents and stakeholders to join us in order to hear about the latest developments and offer them the opportunity to ask any questions and offer comments.
